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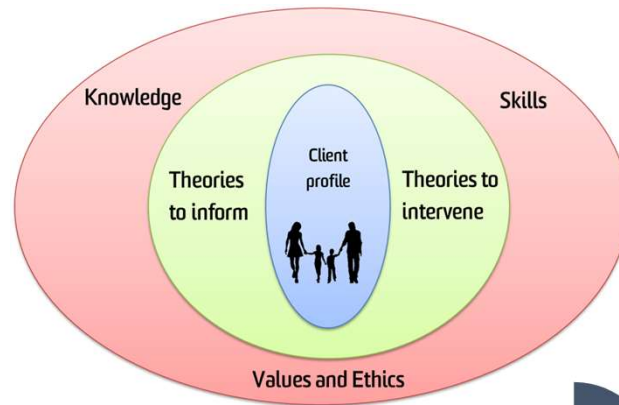
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Organisational Overview: Corrective Services New South Wales (NSW)

- Government funded agency which also includes Child Protection Services, Youth Justice, Housing & Disability, Justice Services (Courts and Tribunals), Law Reform Commission & Legal Services (Legal Aid and Court Support services)
- Annual budget \$2.2 Billion employing over 11,500 staff across the state, comprising of 36 prisons (including 3 privately run) and 57 Community Corrections Offices (DCJ 2022)
- The agency promotes the core values of Service, Trust, Accountability, Integrity and Respect with an overarching mission of reducing re-offending in the community (DCJ 2023)
- Broad organisational parallels with the AASW core values of respect for persons, social justice and professional integrity (AASW Code of Ethics 2020)

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Population overview

- An average of 34,788 people are on community-based orders are supervised daily. An estimated 82% are men and 18% are women .
- Current custodial population totals 13,126, with 93.4% men and 6.6% woman.
- Over representation of First Nations people across both custodial and community populations.
- High remand population.

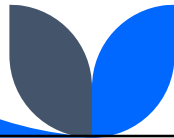
